

Jean Luc Cornille Clinics in Maine—2009

There will be six clinics with Jean Luc Cornille in Maine during the summer of 2010. They will be on the dates and at the locations set out below. You may participate by riding on one or both of the days of the clinics, or by auditing one or both days. The cost of a one-hour individual ride is \$175, payable to the host stable. The cost of auditing is \$20 a day payable to the host stable. There are a limited number of overnight and day-stalls available at each location at a cost of \$20 per day, also payable to the facility.

All horses participating in the clinic must have a negative coggins test within three years of the date of the clinic and proof of up to date vaccinations for rabies, Rhino flu, West Nile Virus, Eastern Equine encephalitis and strangles. Please enclose a photocopy of your coggins test and vaccination certificate with your entry.

Because Jean Luc comes up from Florida to provide these clinics, there must be a minimum number of 16 riding participants over two days and payment must be received by the host stable two weeks before the clinic. If you find during the two weeks immediately prior to the clinic that you will be unable to participate, you may pass your time slot on to another rider as long as their horse has the required vaccinations and coggins test. If you are unable to find a substitute rider and your absence puts participation below the required threshold, your fee will not be refunded if you cancel within two weeks of the clinic.

Although Pam Blake's name and contact information appears on advertizing for the clinics in order to have a single gateway and a person in charge of updating the mailing list, the each of the participating facilities runs its own clinic(s). Accordingly, the primary path of communication, paperwork payment and scheduling will be between you and the facility owner/organizer for a given clinic.
